## 7. PATJI-DAWES AWARD: nominate your inspiring language teacher

You only have until 17 March to nominate a language teacher for this award. As part of the prize, winner and nominator are funded to attend the Australian Federation of Modern Language Teachers Associations’ International Conference on the Gold Coast in July.

The Director of the ARC Centre of Excellence for the Dynamics of Language, Professor Nicholas Evans, says he hopes Australians who have become fluent in a language other than English will nominate their teacher.

“It may be an indigenous language teacher, university teacher of Mandarin, or Indonesian high school teacher, a Spanish teacher of an evening class or teacher from one of Australia’s many multilingual communities. We are asking speakers who have become fluent in another language to nominate the language teacher who inspired them most.”
