The government is inviting responses to the paper (closing date for submissions 30 January 2015) and there will be an ACT Multicultural Summit to discuss it later in November 2014 (contact <u>oma@act.gov.au</u> for details).

Language is not a focus area in the discussion paper, so if you are involved in languages, consider attending the summit or responding to the paper to ensure that language services and/or languages education, including English, are given adequate and appropriate attention in the final Framework.

#### 5. What can the ACT learn from the Victorian new Love of Language website?

Love of Language (<u>http://loveoflanguage.com.au</u>) aims to alert and inspire all parts of the community to the benefits of maintaining mother tongue language and learning additional languages. The site

- recruits, and provides a way to contact, Language Ambassadors
- links to news and information on language-related games, resources and events
- emphasises the role of languages in all spheres of life, including education, sport, trade, international relations, food, fashion, the arts and travel.

Among the ACT government's commitments in <u>Many Voices: 2012-16 ACT Language Policy</u> was the undertaking to:

• work with the ACT languages sector to develop a campaign to promote the benefits of languages education and influence positive attitudes towards languages education in our community (Para 5.16)

This was related to the aim of working "closely with the ACT Community Language Schools Association Inc to develop community understanding of languages education including acknowledgement of the increasing need for languages education in a changing global context, increased linguistic and intercultural capacities of the ACT teaching workforce, and development of positive attitudes towards languages education among students, families, teachers, community groups and education leaders in the ACT (Para 5.10)

Could the Victorian initiative be a model the ACT?

#### 6. Eleven languages curricula now available in the Australian Curriculum

Seven new languages curricula (K to year 10) now available: Arabic, German, Japanese, Korean, Modern Greek, Spanish and Vietnamese (Chinese, French, Italian and Indonesian are already available).

While the curricula for these seven languages are yet to be finalised, the validation versions are being released as a part of the Australian Curriculum development process. The final curricula are scheduled for approval by the Education Council in the coming months. See the curricula in PDF format on the <u>'Languages' page of the ACARA website</u>.

#### 7. New China/Canberra scholarship will send students to Shenzhen

The recent signing of an MOU between ACT Chief Minister Katy Gallagher and Shenzhen Mayor Xu Qín will enable two Canberra students to take part in a new internship program. Canberra will send two students to Shenzhen and two students will come to the ACT, supported by \$30,000 in government funding. The cost of airfares and living expenses will be shared between both governments and business partners.

Ms Gallagher said both cities would benefit from improved capability in science, technology, engineering and mathematics; internship participants would be exposed to learning experiences and social networks in each city.

Applications for the Study Canberra internship program are expected to open soon; the first exchange placements will take place during 2015.
