

# Canberra Region Languages Forum Update May 2013

## 1. DRAFT AUSTRALIAN CURRICULUM: LANGUAGES OPEN FOR CONSULTATION

The draft Foundation to Year 10 curriculum for Arabic, French, German, Indonesian, Japanese, Korean, Modern Greek, Spanish and Vietnamese, along with the draft Framework for Aboriginal Languages and Torres Strait Islander Languages, are opening for public consultation.

Deadline for submissions is **25 July 2013**.

The schedule of release dates is:

- 13 May** French, Indonesian, Korean
- 20 May** Modern Greek, Spanish, Vietnamese, draft Framework for Aboriginal languages and Torres Strait Islander Languages
- 27 May** Arabic, German, Japanese

## 2. CURTIN UNIVERSITY MAY ABANDON LANGUAGE MAJORS

Japanese and Chinese language are among the majors that may disappear at WA's Curtin University. Other low enrolment majors targeted include Asian studies. Units with good enrolments may remain, but the majors are in danger of being axed.

Curtin is the third institution to consider abandoning language programs since the government asked former treasury head Ken Henry to craft an Asian Century strategy. Both La Trobe and the University of NSW were to close their Indonesian programs but retreated in the face of lobbying.

## 8. MANDARIN EDUCATION IN THE ACT: PATHWAYS TO PROFICIENCY

Saturday 10 August at the ANU

A forum to bring together all those involved in Mandarin education in the ACT region, from early childhood to tertiary level, to explore ways to maximise the range and quality of the teaching and learning of Mandarin and to increase student participation and retention rates. Local politicians, Chinese community leaders, and relevant diplomatic personnel and business people, plus some interstate experts will also be invited. The forum will focus on the ACT region to maximise the chances of successful practical outcomes.

The main objectives of the forum are to:

- Develop networks and strategic partnerships to demonstrate and build on the quality and proficiency outcomes of Mandarin programs for children in the ACT

- increase interest in learning and continuing to learn Mandarin in ACT schools, including community language schools
- encourage language maintenance among Canberrans of Chinese background and heritage.

In June 2013, there are plans for an evening seminar to canvass the views and expectations of parents and families in the Canberra region about Mandarin learning in schools so these can be fed into the forum discussion.
