9. Accredited Training for ACT Community Language School teachers

Over 30 community language school teachers have enrolled in the first accredited course in the ACT for community language schools. Funded by the ACT Government and run by the Sydney Institute of Community Language Education (SICLE), the 60-hour course started with 2 evenings of face-to-face sessions at the University of Canberra in the first week of May. The course will continue through weekly online classes culminating with a final face-to-face session in August.
