7. Indigenous language teachers win Patji-Dawes Award 2019

There were two joint winners of the award this year:

- Sophia Mung, a Gija woman from Purnululu (East Kimberley, WA), who has worked for decades ensure the Gija language is passed down to future generations, and
- Brother Stephen Morelli, a Christian Brother, teacher and linguist who has worked closely with Aboriginal communities on the mid-north coast of NSW for over 30 years to revive and teach the Gumbaynggirr language.

The Patji-Dawes Award is Australia's premier award for achievement in teaching languages other than English. It is an initiative of the ARC Centre of Excellence for the Dynamics of Language and supported by the Australian Federation of Modern Language Teachers Associations and the Languages and Cultures Network for Australian Universities.
