# Bridging the gap between pronunciation research and teaching practice

In this final LTF meeting for 2021, Dr Solene Inceoglu will give a short overview of research on pronunciation instruction that has been conducted in laboratory as well as in face-to-face (F2F) and online classroom settings and then show how findings from this research informs pronunciation teaching practice by discussing concrete examples of activity types in the F2F and online classroom as well as showing web-based applications.

#### Celebration of Languages

Over 100 people registered for this event organised by ACTBEA on Saturday 16 October. Officially opened by the ACT Minister for Multicultural Affairs, Tara Cheyne, the event aimed to promote awareness and interest in some of the many languages being spoken and learned in Canberra and how to find out more about them. The program comprised six 30-minute panel discussions, with over 20 presenters sharing their knowledge and experiences about Aboriginal languages, languages from the Indian subcontinent, languages and scripts from East Asia, languages from Europe, interpreting and translating, and Canberra's mother tongue poets.

# 5 Further delay to release of Review of Investment in ACT Community Language Schools

In a motion agreed to by the Legislative Assembly in early August 2021, the ACT government undertook to table the Review report and its recommendations and to respond to these by 31 October 2021. This motion has since been amended due to redeployment of Directorate staff in response to the COVID lockdown, and the Review is now due to be tabled by 31 December, probably in the last sitting week of the year.
